## Kills Well With Others by Deanna Raybourn

Four women assassins, senior in status—and in age—sharpen their knives for another bloody good adventure. They have enjoyed their time off, but the lack of excitement is starting to chafe: a professional killer can only take so many watercolor classes and yoga sessions without itching to strangle someone...literally. When they receive a summons from the head of the elite assassin organization known as the Museum, they are ready to tackle the greatest challenge of their careers.

## The Paris Express by Emma Donoghue

Based on an 1895 disaster that went down in history when it was captured in a series of surreal, extraordinary photographs, this is a propulsive novel set on a train packed with a fascinating cast of characters who hail from Brittany, Russia, Ireland, Algeria, Pennsylvania, and Cambodia. Members of parliament hurry back to Paris to vote; a medical student suspects a girl may be dying; a secretary tries to convince her boss of the potential of moving pictures; two of the train's crew build a life away from their wives; a young anarchist makes a terrifying plan, and much more.

Drawing from her long studies of happiness, writer Gretchen Rubin has discovered the secrets that can help us manage the complexities of life.
