Abe, Shana	A Crown of Stars	In turn of the century England, the Jolivet family lives a charmed existence. Daughter of a wealthy vineyard owner and a French pianist, vivacious Marguerite, the eldest of three, loves spinning stories and entertaining her family's well-connected friends. No one is surprised when she announces, at 18, that she intends to become an actress. Her sister, Inez, a virtuosa violinist, moves to London with her. Soon the two beauties are being celebrated in the highest social circles.
Ackerman, Sara	The Shark House	Hawai'i, 1998. When a string of rare shark attacks unsettles the once-peaceful Kohala coast, marine biologist Minnow Gray is called in to investigate. Known for her uncanny connection to sharks, she is the island's best hope for uncovering why the attacks are happening--a mystery that has both the local community and the tourism industry on edge--and for determining whether the same great white still haunts the coastline.
Adams, Taylor	Her Last Breath	A story of two friends who embark on an ill-fated caving expedition--and the dark truth of what happens deep underground.
Anappara, Deepa	The Last of Earth	1869. Tibet is closed to Europeans, an infuriating obstruction for the rapidly expanding British Empire. In response, Britain begins training Indians--permitted to cross borders that white men may not--to undertake illicit, dangerous surveying expeditions into Tibet. Balram is one such surveyor-spy, an Indian schoolteacher who, for several years, has worked for the British, often alongside his dearest friend, Gyan. But Gyan went missing on his last expedition and is rumored to be imprisoned within Tibet. Desperate to rescue his friend, Balram agrees to guide an English captain on a foolhardy mission.
Austin, Emily	Is This a Cry For Help?	At Darcy's public library, she gets to help a cross-section of humanity: not only the toddlers, book clubs, and precocious teens she originally imagined, but also people who lack stable housing or who struggle with substance abuse or mental illness, job seekers, immigrants, and people with opinions different from her own. She has a wonderful wife with whom she shares her authentic self, two cats, and a lovely home. But when Darcy learns of the death of her ex-boyfriend, she is thrown off balance. The disruptions to her carefully organized life are often hysterically funny even as they are harrowing and tragic.

Bell, A.D.	The Bookbinder's Secret	In Edwardian England, Lilian Delaney's life is full of books. As a female apprentice bookbinder, she's a rarity as she strives for a career in the trade; her father owns a struggling bookshop where she also works. When Lilian is given a partially burned book, she discovers letters hidden beneath the endpapers that tell a tale of doomed lovers, inheritance, and murder.
Berry, Steve	The Devil's Bible	Former Justice Department operative, Cotton Malone, is called to Sweden when the younger sister of King Wilhelm I is kidnapped. The ransom demand? Hand over an 800-year-old book, the Codex Gigas--the largest illuminated medieval manuscript in the world. Claimed as war loot from Bohemia in 1648, it's been kept in Stockholm for nearly 400 years. Along the way it also acquired another more mysterious moniker ... The Devil's Bible.
Blake, Audrey	All In Her Hands	Dr. Nora Gibson trained with other female physicians and midwives in Italy to earn her medical degree. After returning to England in 1849, Nora fights to train the midwives of England and spread awareness of their knowledge and potential usefulness in the medical field. With a cholera epidemic spreading, now is the time to have more hands helping with nursing, birthing, and treating patients. What starts as an average story about a woman fighting for her right to work in a man's world quickly turns into a page-turner when disease strikes Nora and her family.
Burke, James Lee	The Hadacol Boogie	Robicheaux, a Louisiana cop is irked, to put it mildly, when a mysterious individual dumps the body of a murdered woman on his property. Was it a personal message or simply a convenient spot to dump a body? Robicheaux's investigation takes him down a dark road and puts his own daughter, Alafair, at risk.
Cash, Madeline	Lost Lambs	The Flynn family is coming undone. Catherine and Bud's open marriage has reached its breaking point as their daughters spiral in their own chaotic orbits: Abigail, the eldest, is dating a man in his twenties nicknamed War Crime Wes; Louise, the middle child, maintains a secret correspondence with an online terrorist; the brilliant youngest, Harper, is being sent to wilderness reform camp due to her insistence that someone--or something--is monitoring the town's citizens.
Crouch, Sarah	The Briars	Game warden Annie Heston seeks a fresh start in the misty forests of Washington State in the haunting latest from Crouch (Middletide). Following a bad breakup, Annie has relocated to the small town of Lake Lumins. Her first job tracking a cougar for local sheriff Jake Proudly takes a grim turn when Annie discovers the body of a young woman near the town's central lake. Though the cause of death initially appears to be an animal attack, the coroner's report soon reveals the girl was strangled.

Cullen, Lynn	When We Were Brilliant	In 1952, Norma Jeane Baker follows documentary photographer Eve Arnold into a powder room on the night they first meet. She has a proposition for her. Norma Jeane created Marilyn Monroe to be photographed, and she wants Eve to do it. Eve is better than anyone she's seen at revealing a person's inner truth. Together they can help each other. Together, she says, they can make something brilliant.
Curtis, Debra	Laws of Love and Magic	In the serene town of Portsmouth, Rhode Island, Lily Webb is deeply in love with a charismatic boy, a college-bound quarterback whose spectacular athletic talents are matched only by his fierce devotion. But their dreams of a life together are cut short when his passionate protectiveness leads to an irrevocable choice--one that tears them apart and leads Lily down a path of heartbreak from which she may never recover.
Darlington, Leodora	The Exes	Everybody has a few bad relationships under their belt, right? Natalie's just trying to move forward with her husband James and put those terrible experiences behind her. But the ugly truth is that her exes are literal skeletons in her figurative closet--and she's not entirely sure if she put them there.
Dunn, Casey	The Wind Witch Murders	Raven was tiny when her mother, Deanne, was accused of murdering two young boys, declared unstable, and sent to an asylum. With no father around, Raven was left to be raised by her strict and devout grandmother. When Raven is 18, her mother dies, and Raven feels bereft. Besides being an accused murderess, Deanne was also known as "The Wind Witch," feared as a member of the mysterious Hill People cult but revered for her healing powers.
Ellsworth, Loretta	The Jilted Countess	The war stole Roza Meszaros's dreams of becoming a ballerina and her aristocratic family's fortune. But the penniless Hungarian countess's fate takes a hopeful turn when she meets an American soldier named Joe, who promises to marry her and take her to the States. After two years of waiting to obtain the necessary money and paperwork to emigrate, Roza finally arrives in Minnesota--and discovers Joe has married someone else.
Everhart, Donna	Women of a Promiscuous Nature	One day in 1941, Ruth, a single woman living alone in North Carolina, is on her way to work in a diner when she is stopped by a sheriff and questioned about her activities. Accused of promiscuity, Ruth is transported to the State Industrial Farm Colony for Women, a reform school where sterilization, punishment, and incarceration are the norm. Summarily imprisoned and forced to receive mercury treatments for a venereal disease that she doesn't have, Ruth tries to figure out how to get home.

Fein, Louise	Book of Forbidden Words	Enjoy this new historical novel set in a world of banned books and censorship, in which an encrypted manuscript unleashes a chain of consequences across 400 years.
Garcia, Jessie	The Fair Weather Friend	It's always sunny for Faith Richards. The popular TV meteorologist, endearingly referred to as "The Fair Weather Friend" by her viewers, has the world in the palm of her hand. But one night, Faith leaves work while on a dinner break and never returns. Her body is found the next morning.
Ginder, Grant	So Old, So Young	In 2007, two years after graduating from the University of Pennsylvania, Richie's friends join him at his crowded New Year's Eve party in Lower Manhattan. From there, the story unfolds in a series of occasions over the next decade, including a Cancún wedding in 2014 for friends of Mia's, Adam's Labor Day party in the Hamptons in 2018, and Sasha and Theo's 2022 Halloween party in New Jersey.
Goodman, Allegra	This Is Not About Us	A kaleidoscopic portrait of a modern American family--steadfast, complicated, begrudging, and loving--from the bestselling author of Isola.
Graham, Heather	The Witching Hours	A haunting murder and kidnapping on the outskirts of Salem, Massachusetts, sends two people with unique talents hunting for answers from both the past and present.
Groff, Lauren	Brawler	Ranging from the 1950s to the present day and moving across age, class, and region--from New England to Florida to California--these nine stories reflect and expand upon a shared theme: the ceaseless battle between humans' dark and light angels.
Hannah, Sophie	No One Would Do What the Lamberts Have Done	You think it will never happen to you. The doorbell. The policeman. The words that turn your world inside out: I'm afraid there's been an incident... For Sally Lambert, those words mean only one thing--danger. Not just for her family, but for Champ, their loyal and beloved dog. A single accusation, a neighbor's grudge, and suddenly the Lamberts are trapped in a nightmare with no escape.
Hassan, Aisha	When the Fireflies Dance	On the outskirts of Lahore, Pakistan, a large yellow moon hung low in the sky when the men came with dogs and guns and cricket bats. When Landon's affair with local teen Lo Bailey is discovered, Lo is accused of murder and of using the storm to cover up her crime.
Hurwitz, Gregg	Antihero	Once a black ops assassin for the government known as Orphan X, Evan Smoak broke with the program and went deep underground, using his operational rules and skills to help the truly desperate with nowhere else to turn.
Jaye, Lola	The Manual for Good Wives	Everything about Adeline Coplefield is a lie . . . To the world Mrs. Coplefield is the epitome of Victorian propriety: an exemplary society lady who writes a weekly column advising young ladies on how to be better wives. Only Adeline has never been a good wife or mother; she has no claim to the Coplefield name, nor is she an English lady . . .
Johal, Gurnaik	Saraswati	Centuries ago, the myths say, the holy river Saraswati flowed through what is now Northern India. But when Satnam arrives in his ancestral village for his grandmother's funeral, he is astonished to find water in the long-dry well behind her house. The discovery sets in motion a contentious scheme to unearth the lost river and build a gleaming new city on its banks, and Satnam--adrift from his job, girlfriend, and flat back in London--soon finds himself swept up in this ferment of Hindu nationalist pride.
Johnson, Sadeqa	Keeper of Lost Children	One American woman's vision in post WWII Germany will tie together three people in an unexpected way.
Jones, Tayari	Kin	Annie and Vernice grew up without their mothers, raised by their Granny and Auntie, respectively. When Annie runs away to Memphis in search of her mama and Vernice goes off to college in Atlanta, their paths begin to diverge, physically and socially. Despite those widening differences, they stay connected, understanding that "What you have the same isn't what binds you. Hearts grow strings because of what you know that's the same, what happened to you that's the same."
Kane, Darby	Such a Clever Girl	Fifteen years ago, the Tanner family vanished without a trace, leaving behind a chilling scene: half-eaten meals, a bloodstain by the door, and a smoldering fire consuming their business across town. In a race against time, these women must confront the truth or risk becoming the next victims of a past they cannot escape. With tension rising and danger lurking, one thing is clear: someone is destined to kill again.

Kantra, Virginia	Anne of a Different Island	Anne Gallagher has always lived by the book. Anne of Green Gables, that is. Growing up on Mackinac Island, she saw herself as her namesake: the same impulsive charm, the same wild imagination, even the same red hair (dyed, but still). She followed in Anne Shirley's fictional footsteps, chasing dreams of teaching and writing, and falling for her very own storybook hero.
Kardos, Michael	Fun City Heist	Mo Melnick used to be a drummer in rock band Sunshine Apocalypse. He used to be someone. These days he rents beach umbrellas on the Jersey Shore. The last thing he expects is for Johnny Clay, his old bandmate turned enemy, to ask him a favor. Johnny's dying, and before he passes he wants Sunshine Apocalypse to reunite for one last gig at Fun City, the beachfront amusement park where their musical journey began. Mo's in--reluctantly. But then Johnny reveals his real plan: He doesn't just want to play at Fun City on the fourth of July. He wants to rob it.
Koontz, Dean	The Friend of the Family	The human "oddities" in the Museum of the Strange are less wondrous than the gawking rubes had been promised. But Alida is something else. The real thing. Traveling Depression-era America from carnival midways to speakeasies, Alida is resigned to an exploited and lonely life on the road as the museum's golden ticket. Until she's rescued by two compassionate strangers.
Kovac, Christina	Watch Us Fall	Four former Georgetown University suitemates and new graduates, brilliant young women just beginning to live their dreams, renting a charming old house together in a quaint neighborhood and embarking on fulfilling first jobs. Life is perfect until Addie's boyfriend Josh goes missing. A prominent investigative reporter from a well-known Washington family, Josh had been behaving strangely in the weeks before his disappearance, and when the police investigation seems to be going nowhere, Lucy, the roommate closest to Addie, becomes obsessed with finding him.
Kubica, Mary	It's Not Her	Courtney Gray's peaceful vacation turns into a nightmare when she discovers her brother and sister-in-law dead in their lakeside cottage. Her niece Reese is missing. Her nephew Wyatt is asleep upstairs--unharmd. As police swarm the quiet resort, dark truths about Courtney's family--and the town itself--begin to surface. Is Reese a victim... or the killer?
Labuskes, Brianna	Her Beautiful Life	The truth of one woman's private life reveals the terrifying depths to which people will go to deceive.

Lawson, Mike	The Asset	Mahoney wants longtime fixer Joe DeMarco to determine whether Lydia Chang, the much younger wife of Sen. Douglas "Dutch" McMillian, has really been meeting with Zhou Enlai, an intelligence officer at D.C.'s Chinese embassy, whom Diane claims has pressed Lydia to become an agent for the Chinese government.
Levy, Marc	Symphony of Monsters	A mother's love knows no borders, and her fight knows no limits. Veronika, a nurse, returns home to find that her nine-year-old son, Valentyn, has disappeared. Overcome with a mother's terror but fueled by relentless love, Veronika embarks on a perilous journey to find him.
Lloyd, Josie	You & Me and You & Me and You & Me	Jules and Adam, married for almost 25 years, are stuck in a rut. Adam's best friend rubs salt in an old wound when he moves in nearby after selling a video game company for millions of dollars--a deal Adam could have been part of, if he hadn't backed out years ago. Then Adam finds a pile of old mixtapes that he and Jules made for each other over the course of their relationship. Somehow, the mixtapes act as a time portal, depositing the couple at the exact moment when they exchanged them.
Ludlum, Robert (Brian Freeman)	The Bourne Revenge	Shadow - the head of Treadstone - has found evidence of massive Chinese espionage activity in the U.S. The spy running the operations is a shadowy American known only by the codename Bai Ze. No one knows who he is, but when Shadow consults the Files - the hacked AI database she stole from the Chinese - she discovers that Jason Bourne encountered Bai Ze during an operation eight years earlier.
Malicka, Philippa	In Her Defense	As a sensational celebrity libel trial unfolds, a young woman at the periphery secretly wields the power to make or break the case. But with her own hidden past, will she dare to speak up?
Marrs, John	Dead in the Water	When Damon survives a near-drowning, his life flashes before his eyes. Every memory is crystal clear--except one. A dead boy. A face he can't place. A moment he doesn't remember living. At first he tells himself it's a trick of the mind. But everything else he saw was real. So why not this?

McCurdy, Jennette	Half His Age	Waldo is ravenous. Horny. Blunt. Naive. Wise. Impulsive. Lonely. Angry. Forceful. Hurting. Perceptive. Endlessly wanting. McLynn, Fiza	The Midnight Carousel	Maisie Marlowe has come to America for a fresh start. After discovering an antique fairground carousel, she is seized by the idea of running a glittering amusement park. But little does she know that the wondrous object has a sinister past of its own.
Meyer, Lily	The End of Romance	Sylvie Broder was taught early to embrace joy. The granddaughter of Holocaust survivors whose greatest priority was enjoying the life they'd snatched back from Hitler, Sylvie believes in the tenacious pursuit of pleasure--yet, somehow, finds herself trapped in a suffocating, emotionally abusive marriage. With enormous fortitude, Sylvie frees herself and turns to graduate school, where she develops a new philosophy: Straight women will find true liberation and happiness only once romance is eradicated.

She is successful in her publishing career, but in all other parts of her life, she is just going through the motions. Then, after a random phone call from a bookstore owner named Alfie, she discovers her husband devised a plan to help her through her grief.
Panitch, Seth	Antique	Grace Schaffer is adrift. Raised by an eminent but emotionally withdrawn scholar, her talent landed her a coveted spot on Antiques Roadshow, where she charmed legions of viewers. But she's recently fallen from her gilded perch, losing her career, her marriage and her very identity in the process, leaving her with the same question her clients so often ask of her: What is it worth? Or, the question that beats beneath it, What am I worth?
Paris, B.A.	When I Kill You	B. A. Paris returns with a triumphant, unsettling suspense novel.
Parkman, Karen	The Jills	A Buffalo Bills cheerleader will stop at nothing to solve the disappearance of her best friend and teammate, navigating the dark underbelly of a hardscrabble city, the grime and glamour of professional cheerleading, and her own tangled family history.
Parks, Brad	The Flack	Newspaper reporter Curtis Hinton lives in the Midwest with his pregnant wife, Page, and is realizing that his salary won't support Page's dream of being a stay-at-home mother. When his old roommate Angel Reddish, the chief operations officer at Bay Area Logistics Company (Balco), urges him to apply to be the VP of communications, Curtis complies. He dreads the notion of being a corporate flack, but the position would offer security for his growing family. Curtis gets the job, only to be blindsided on day one, when he learns that Angel was murdered the night before.

Patterson, James (Brian Sitts)	Cross & Sampson	Metro PD detective John Sampson stands in a crater in the middle of a DC street, calling in the bomb squad. "Dispatch, this is Sampson. Contact the FBI and the ATF. We've got a suspected terrorist attack here. Alex Cross searches the apartment of a missing psychology grad student--his own son Damon. Has following in his famous father's footsteps made Damon a target? From FBI headquarters, in police stations, on airplanes, and at murder scenes, the detectives track crimes committed hundreds of miles apart. It will take more than distance to weaken the partnership of Sampson & Cross.
Quindlen, Anna	More Than Enough	High school English teacher Polly Goodman can talk about everything and anything with the women in her book club, which is why they've become her closest friends and, along with her veterinarian husband, the bedrock of her life. Her students, her fraught relationship with her mother, her struggles with IVF--Polly's book club friends have heard about it all. But when they give Polly an ancestry test kit as a joke, the results match her with a stranger. It is clear to Polly that this match is a mistake, but still she cannot help but comb through her family history for answers. Then, when it seems that the book club circle of four will become three, Polly learns how friendships can change your life in the most profound ways.
Quinn, Kate	The Astral Library	Alexandria "Alix" Watson has learned one lesson from her barren childhood in the foster-care system: unlike people, books will never let you down. Rollins, James	Trust No One	From the master of international intrigue comes a shocking new stand-alone thriller that thrusts a group of university students, falsely accused of murder, into a treacherous hunt across Europe, all to unlock the secrets buried within a centuries-old book that could change humankind forever.
Ross, Harper	The Unwritten Rules of Magic	Emerson Clarke can't remember a time when she felt in control. Her father--a celebrated author--was a chaotic force until he got Alzheimer's. Her mother turned to gin. And recently, her teen daughter has shut her out without explanation. Gloria is thrilled when sweet, kind, helpful Martine arrives. But Nico is skeptical. A classic live-at-home Gen Zer with no interest in adulthood, Nico resents any interruption of his "hovercraft repose."
St. James, Simone	A Box Full of Darkness	Strange things happen in Fell, New York. A mysterious drowning at the town's roadside motel. The unexplained death of a young girl whose body is left by the railroad tracks.
